City of San Buenaventura Awarded \$800,000 for Affordable Housing

SACRAMENTO, January 31, 2007- The California Housing Finance Agency's (CalHFA), Housing Enabled by Local Partnerships (HELP) Program has awarded the Housing Authority of the City of San Buenaventura \$800,000 to help finance the development of affordable rental units.

The Housing Authority will leverage the HELP Program financing by pooling it with other sources of affordable housing funds. The HELP funds will be used to assist with the development of 12 affordable residential rental units in a new mixed-use building that includes a small commercial space. The residential component of the building will serve those with annual household incomes at or below 50% of area median income. Support services that address the needs of the residents will be provided through the developer. This project will increase the availability of local rental housing with a long-term affordability commitment of 55 years.

"The HELP Program provides financial resources for local government entities, like City of San Buenaventura, to act on innovative strategies to produce and maintain affordable housing stock," said Theresa Parker, CalHFA Executive Director. "Increasing local affordable housing stock creates more opportunities for those who work in the community to live in the community."

Additionally, a total of \$7.5 million in CalHFA's HELP financing has been awarded to seven other California localities. Commitments were made to the following entities:

Since 1998, the HELP Program has partnered with 102 local government entities to fund \$160 million in low interest HELP loans to acquire, develop, rehabilitate, or preserve affordable rental or ownership housing. CalHFA funding provides additional resources to address localities' unmet affordable housing needs by using a competitive process to award loans with repayment terms of up to ten years at 3.5% simple interest. Through the HELP program, CalHFA offers two funding cycles of approximately \$7.5 million in the fall and spring of each year. Recipients of the semi-annual award are evaluated on six criteria: affordability, cost efficiency, maximization of benefits, implementation readiness, resource impact and comprehensiveness of program design.

The California Housing Finance Agency was created in 1975 to meet the housing needs of low and moderate income Californians. To date, HELP funding has contributed to the financing of nearly 19,500 units of affordable housing for Californians who are most in need.
